

150th Anniversary Gala

With its theme of “Looking Back...Moving Forward,” Long Island College Hospital’s 150th Anniversary Gala celebrated both LICH’s extraordinary past and its commitment to the future. Attended by nearly 500 guests at Stage 6 at Steiner Studios on October 4, 2008, the gala raised more than \$400,000 to help the hospital provide medical care and services of the highest caliber to the residents of Brooklyn and greater New York. Gala proceeds will be used to purchase vital equipment for the hospital, including a “Volcano” Intravascular Ultrasound machine used during Coronary Angioplasty and an Alsius Coolguard 3000 Intravascular Temperature Management System used to “cool down” some heart attack and stroke patients when they first come to the Emergency Department.

At the event, guests paid tribute to LICH’s entire medical staff for their countless contributions to their patients, to LICH, and to the entire field of medicine. The gala also honored LICH’s own Vice President of Nursing, Catherine Gallogly-Simon, RN, MS, CCRN, for her 20 years of service to LICH and its patients. 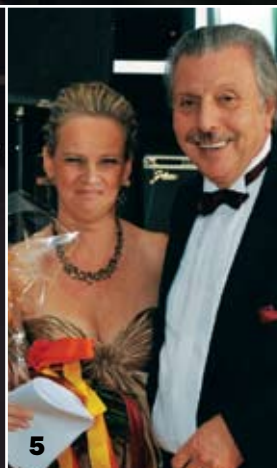

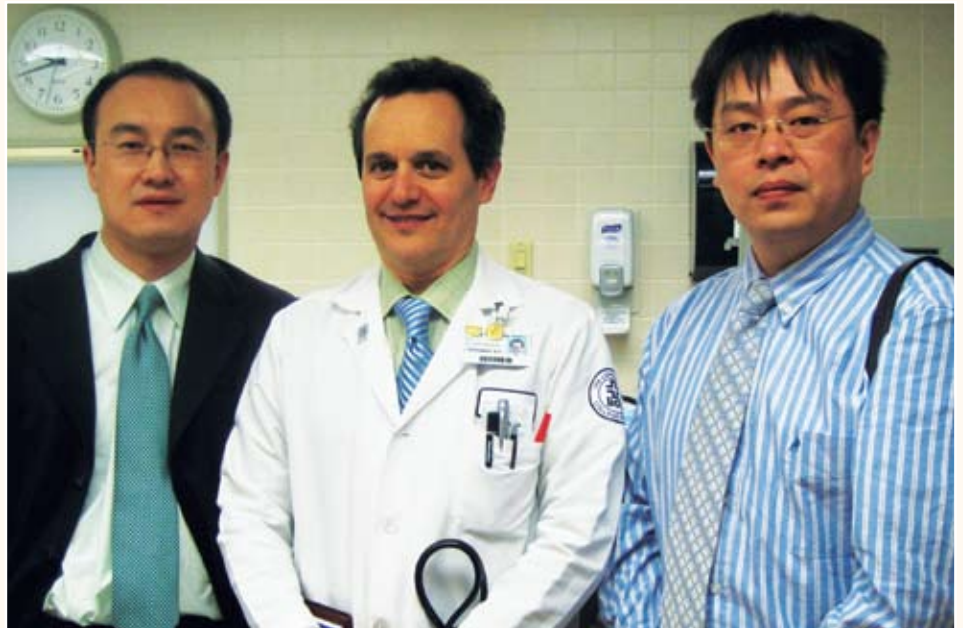
